

Biological Father's Worksheet

Use this worksheet to gather the information you need to complete the [Do-It-Yourself Revoke Paternity Established by Marriage](#). The more information you have when you begin, the faster you can finish and get your forms.

Information about Court Cases

Find out if there is a child support order requiring the mother's husband (or ex-husband) to pay child support for this child.

Find out if there is a pending (ongoing) or finished divorce, separate maintenance, or family support case between the mother and her husband. If so, you will need to know:

- The case number
- The court where the case was filed
- The judge's name
- Whether the mother is the Plaintiff or Defendant
- If either person has a lawyer in that case, the lawyer's address and phone number

If there has **not** been a divorce, separate maintenance, or family support case, find out if there has ever been any other case involving child support, parenting time, or custody of the child in a Michigan court. If so, you will need to know:

- The case number
- The court where the case was filed
- The judge's name
- Whether the mother is the Plaintiff or Defendant
- If either person has a lawyer in that case, the lawyer's address and phone number

Other Cases

If the mother and her husband do not have any of the cases listed above, you will need the following information:

Find out if there are any other pending or resolved cases in family court involving the mother and her husband. If so, you will need to know:

- If the case is still active
- The case number
- The court where the case was filed
- The judge's name

Find out if there has ever been an abuse or neglect case (child protective case) involving the child. If so, you will need to know:

- The case number
- The court where the case was filed

Find out if there has ever been a juvenile delinquency case involving the child. If so, you will need to know:

- The case number

The court where the case was filed

Find out if there is any other Michigan court with continuing jurisdiction over the child. If so, you will need to know:

The court where the case was filed

Other Information

The husband's full name, address, and telephone number

The mother's full name, address, and telephone number

The child's full name and birth date

Whether the mother was married when the child was conceived

If there is a child support order requiring the husband to pay child support, whether he has substantially failed to pay for the last two years or more

If there **is not** a child support order requiring the husband to pay child support, whether he has failed, without good cause, to provide regular and substantial support for the child for the last two years or more

Whether the husband lives with the child
